### **Brattleboro Museum & Art Center Presents Third Domino-Toppling Extravaganza**

*Brattleboro, Vt.*—Two years ago, brothers Mike and Steve Perrucci from eastern Pennsylvania traveled to Brattleboro, Vt. to build and then topple a custom-made domino course in the main gallery of the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center. Neither they nor the throngs of eager onlookers who packed the museum for the toppling were quite sure what to expect. Suffice to say, the event was a huge success, which led to the Perruccis making a return appearance last year. They are now gearing up for their third visit, which will take place at BMAC on Monday, March 1 at 5:30 p.m. Admission is free for children 8 and under, \$3 for BMAC members, \$5 for all others. Doors will open at 4:30 p.m. Reservations are not necessary.

“As great a time as we’ve had these past two years,” said museum director Danny Lichtenfeld, “this year’s event is going to be even better.” For one thing, Lichtenfeld explained, the Perruccis are adding height into the mix. “They’ve already figured out how to fill up all the available floor space, so now they’re expanding upward with specially-designed towers and stunts.” Like last year, the domino course will be arranged in the museum’s main gallery, with the audience viewing from the perimeter. Real-time video of the toppling will once again be projected on the walls, so that everyone can see all the action.

As in the past, the audience member who comes closest to guessing the exact number of dominoes in the course will win a prize and have the honor of initiating the toppling.

The March 1 event marks the end of the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center's 2009-2010 season, major support for which has been provided by BMAC members and Entergy Vermont Yankee, Foard Panel, C&S Wholesale Grocers, Sam's Outdoor Outfitters, and Chittenden Bank. Following this event, the Museum will close for annual building maintenance and repairs, re-opening on Sunday, March 28 with all new exhibits and programs.

Founded in 1972, the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center presents art and ideas in ways that inspire, educate, and engage people of all ages. Each season features compelling new exhibits of contemporary artwork by regional and internationally acclaimed artists, complemented by lectures, artist talks, film screenings, and other public programs.
