Last Chance to View Historic Railroad Photographs And Four Other Exhibits at the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center

Brattleboro, Vt.—Since July the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center has welcomed a steady stream of visitors to its five most recent exhibits, which include historic railroad photographs by O. Winston Link, an interactive exhibit involving the future development of Brattleboro's riverfront, and more. The last day to view these five exhibits is Sunday, October 24. The museum will close to the public the following day to de-install the exhibits, re-opening Friday, October 29 for its annual three-day LEGO Contest. All new exhibits will open to the public on Saturday, November 6.

"This latest collection of exhibits has been very well-attended," said BMAC director Danny Lichtenfeld. He noted that the O. Winston Link railroad photographs and the interactive exhibit dealing with the Brattleboro riverfront have attracted many newcomers to the museum. Of all five exhibits, which also include sculpture by a group of Boston-based artists, an installation by Andy Yoder, and a portrait of the Connecticut River by Sandy Gellis, Lichtenfeld said, "This has been a particularly compelling group of shows. It will be bittersweet to see them come down."

Founded in 1972, the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center presents art and ideas in ways that inspire, educate, and engage people of all ages. Each season features compelling new exhibits of contemporary artwork by regional and internationally acclaimed artists, complemented by lectures, artist talks, film screenings, and other public programs. Located in historic Union Station in downtown Brattleboro, at the intersection of Main Street (Route 5) and Routes 119 and 142, the Museum is wheelchair accessible.
