## **Williams Gives Curator Tour of BMAC's Exhibits**

Brattleboro, Vt. — Take a lunch break at the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center at 12 noon on Wednesday, January 30, and join BMAC's chief curator, Mara Williams, for a guided tour through the Museum's current exhibits. Regular Museum admission applies: \$4 adults, \$3 seniors, \$2 students; BMAC members and children 6 and under are admitted free.

Williams's popular tours are full of art history, philosophical concepts, anecdotes, technical analysis, and personal insights. This tour will feature several new exhibits, as time allows: the paintings and sculpture of "Networks and Intersections" in the main gallery; Barbara Takenaga's paintings in "Cosmos" and Alisa Dworsky's installation "InTension" in the two small galleries; and narrative paintings in "Worth a Thousand Words II" in the large middle gallery.

Other exhibits also at the Museum through March 22 are "Urban Blooms—Ceramic Sculpture by Linda Huey," and "Peter Sís—Tibet Through the Red Box" in the activity gallery.

Museum galleries are open 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. every day except Tuesday; please check for holiday and exhibit change closings before visiting. Admission is \$4 for adults, \$3 for seniors, \$2 for students. Museum members and children six years old and younger are admitted free of charge. The Brattleboro Museum & Art Center is located in Union Station at the intersection of Main Street (Route 5) and Routes 119 and 142 in downtown Brattleboro. The Museum is wheelchair accessible, and parking is available in front of the building.
